Neighbor to Neighbor has been known in Greenwich for the past 26 years. Its current president, Julie Ricciardi, is a second-generation member of her family who has served this local community outreach program, which provides food and clothing to those in need.

Ms. Ricciardi's mother, Betty Sheridan, past president of the organization, was one of the founding members of Neighbor to Neighbor. Ms. Ricciardi grew up serving the program alongside her mother.

'I am now teaching my own two children the importance of helping our neighbors and am integrating this as a part of the fabric of their lives," Ms. Ricciardi said. "I am so proud to be involved with this organization that feeds and clothes almost 1,000 people every week in our own ZIP codes. I am one of hundreds of volunteers from the ages of 9 to 90 that help to do this.'

More than a common food pantry, Neighbor to Neighbor is unusual in Greenwich, as well as in the entire state of Connecticut, offering highly nutritional and fresh foods, including meats, vegetables and fruits. It also provides dignity to its clients, as the pantry is set up like a grocery store and people may choose their items, even among different brands.

"The community is really the engine of Neighbor to Neighbor," Ms Ricciardi added. "We are grateful to those that provide their time, their clothing, their food, and their monetary support.'
