She obtained her bachelor's degree from Amherst College in Massachusetts and her master's in business administration from Dartmouth's Tuck School of Business in New Hampshire. She has worked in advertising and marketing as an account manager for such companies as Saatchi and Saatchi Advertising, General Mills and Unilever's Chesebrough-Pond's. Ms. Dishner chose to put her successful marketing career on hold to be a stay-at-home mom when she was pregnant with her first child 13 years ago, but it was not long before she felt the need to put her talents back to work while giving back to her community.

During the early years of her community service, Ms. Dishner started helping out with the local Red Cross and Kids In Crisis. She also became an active volunteer in her a cappella singing group, The Grace Notes. Ms. Dishner has continued to work as a volunteer of the organization on an ongoing basis in addition to performing with the group. Last year, she became president of the board of directors and is currently serving her second term.

In 2004, Ms. Dishner stepped into her first high-profile position as the Boys and Girls Club's benefit chairwoman, planning and executing the "There's No Place Like Home" Gala that launched the organization's new building. In 2006, her husband, a Greenwich YMCA board member, asked her to chair the Y's first-ever gala fundraiser commemorating the building's expansion.

"For themed fund-raisers, the financial and social success of an event is not only about marketing, planning, and execution," Ms. Dishner said. "It is also very dependent on people getting into it. It was unbelievable how much the attendees enjoyed the YM's prom in 2007. The concept was fresh and the theme was embraced by all."

Ms. Dishner has held a board position for the Greenwich Skating Club and continues to work for her girls' school, Greenwich Country Day School.

"I am extremely fortunate to be able to donate my time and expertise to these worthy organizations," Ms. Dishner said. However, she doesn't leave the focus on herself for very long, crediting others who serve in town, too. "There are many highly educated women and men in our community who contribute significantly to the many community outreach organizations here in Greenwich."

Ms. Dishner has been a resident of Greenwich for 15 years and lives in Old Greenwich with her husband and two daughters. She enjoys tennis and traveling with her family.
